Ms. Lee Shi-ne, a *zainichi* Korean who filed and won a lawsuit with the Osaka High Court against the *Zaitokukai* or the anti-Korean extremist group, and Ms. Motoko Yamagishi from J-CaRM invite you to discuss what we can do to eliminate the hate speech and xenophobia.
